

As the APAO Young Ophthalmologist (YO) movement nears its 10th year, we took a moment to pause and listen. Through a region-wide online survey, we reached out to the heart of the movement- the YOs themselves. The goal? To understand its impact, identify unmet needs, and help shape the future of YO programs. The online survey explored three key areas: demographics, perceptions, and the benefits of YO initiatives.

A total of 387 YOs from 21 countries responded, with the highest participation from the Philippines, India, Bangladesh, and Indonesia—highlighting a possibly stronger local YO engagement in these countries.



Most respondents were in the early stages of their careers (ages 31–35), and a large number (260) reported active involvement in local societies. YO contrast. fewer (187)were engaged with the APAO platform, pointing to potential areas for broader regional international integration and collaboration.


Respondents were asked to rank the perceived significance several key YO programs to them, including support & facilitation of clinical programs, development of YO networks, leadership development, non-clinical professional development, mentorship opportunities, access to job or fellowship opportunities, research and collaboration, and drive advocacy programs. Across both local and APAO settings, the majority rated these areas as "significant" to "most significant," highlighting their relevance to today's YO's.


When evaluating current benefits of YO programs in both the local and APAO communities, the results closely mirrored perception trends. Respondents ranked clinical and community training and education programs, leadership development, professional development, mentorship and career guidance, fellowship and job opportunities, and research collaborations highly.


Most responses leaned toward the higher end of the scale (3 or 4 out of 5), reflecting satisfaction with the current offerings. More respondents answered 5 or "most significant" benefits from YO programs in their local compared to their APAO communities.


These findings reaffirm the value of the YO platform, which extends clinical trainina beyond leadership encompass development, networking, and personal growth. The results stand as a testament to the positive reception of the YO community's advocacies. While overall outcomes appear encouraging, statistical analysis revealed relatively high standard deviations, reflecting disparities responses among APAO in countries. This suggests that the platform's impact influenced by the strength and activity of local YO communities. The data also underscores the further need to strengthen engagement, networking, collaboration, and mentorship across the APAO YO network.








The APAO-AIOS 2025 Congress, hosted at the Yashobhoomi Convention Centre in New Delhi, brought together young ophthalmologists from across Asia-Pacific and beyond. With a rich blend of scientific exchange, cultural engagement, and global networking, YOs made a resounding mark at this prestigious gathering.

The YO Pavilion at APAO-AIOS 2025 emerged as a vibrant nucleus of activity, purposefully designed to reflect the diverse aspirations and talents of young ophthalmologists. Spanning four power-packed days, the Pavilion offered a thoughtfully curated blend of academic challenge, peer engagement, and personal growth.

It opened with The Squid Games: Survive, Thrive, and Conquer!, a gamified clinical showdown that tested participants' diagnostic agility and surgical strategy. Collectively, these sessions showcased not only competence creativity and young ophthalmologists, but also their commitment to shaping a compassionate and collaborative future for global eye care.

In parallel, the APAO Young Ophthalmologists (YO) Symposium brought together top emerging voices across the Asia-Pacific. The session featured outstanding free paper presentations from selected APAO YOs, addressing innovations in cataract surgery, retinal diagnostics, and uveitis biomarkers. It also included two high-level panel discussions—The Future of Young Ophthalmologists Around the World-with dynamic insights from YO leaders representing diverse global regions. The session culminated in the presentation of the APAO YO Awards, Travel Grants, and the YO Rising Star Graduation Ceremony, celebrating the accomplishments promise of and the next generation.

# GLOBAL YO SYMPOSIUM 2025

The 3rd Global Young Ophthalmologist (GYO) Summit was successfully hosted in Taiwan, continuing the vibrant momentum from the previous summit in Singapore. Coinciding with the 20th anniversary of the Taiwan Society of Cataract & Refractive Surgeons (TSCRS), the event provided a dynamic platform specifically designed for young ophthalmologists worldwide

Distinctively different from conventional ophthalmology meetings, the GYO Summit emphasized a relaxed, engaging atmosphere. Chairs actively encouraged open dialogue among panelists and the audience, fostering vibrant exchanges and candid discussions rarely seen in traditional scientific conferences..

The casual yet focused environment allowed attendees to voice their perspectives freely, creating a sense of community and mutual learning.

This year's program featured lively discussions on important and controversial issues, such as the viability of Extended (EDOF) Focus Depth intraocular lenses replacina multifocal/trifocal lenses, the potential of Keratolenticular Extraction (KLEX) to supersede LASIK, and the appropriateness of keratorefractive surgery in with thin corneas. patients Sessions spanned refractive surgery, surgical retina, glaucoma, oculoplastics, myopia management, neuro-ophthalmology, and medical retina applications of artificial intelligence.

critical Broader issues ophthalmology's future-such as sustainability, global eye outreach, health challenges facing women ophthalmologists-were explored, showcasing diverse international perspectives and fostering collaborative relationships among YOs.



The summit concluded with the YO Night at ABV Bar & Kitchen, providing delegates an casual and inspiring networking opportunity.

The energetic participation and overwhelmingly positive feedback reflected a collective enthusiasm for cultivating the next generation of global ophthalmic leaders.





On-ground learning remains central to YOSI's vision. Live Surgical Sessions and Clinical CMEs are conducted regularly in collaboration with medical training centers across India, providing hands-on experience and valuable interaction among peers. Additionally, YOSI contributes to major state and national conferences through the YO Pavilion, a space dedic ated to young ophthalmologists' academic engagement.

YOSI also creates value through its educational tools and digital platforms. YO Tube, a curated video channel, delivers surgical pearls and expert insights. The quarterly magazine YO Times features contributions from leaders and showcases achievements within the YO community. Flash Notes, a quick-reference guide, helps simplify complex ophthalmic topics for rapid review.

Extending its vision beyond national borders, YOSI has signed Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with several young ophthalmologist societies across Asia. These international collaborations enable academic exchange, shared learning, and global exposure—positioning YOSI as a leading voice in the global YO movement.
